

Do This Next - Steering Knuckle Replacement Checklist

1. Identify front left or right steering knuckle for replacement; record your VIN and drivetrain (FWD, AWD, or RWD).
2. Decide whether to buy a bare knuckle (reuse old hub/bearing) or a complete assembly (hub pre-installed) based on downtime and warranty preferences.
3. Collect 2-3 detailed quotes that specify: parts source, labor hours, alignment, ADAS calibration, and any extra hub or ABS sensor replacement.
4. Ask about rust-belt or seized bolt contingencies; request a "not-to-exceed" clause to avoid surprise labor costs.
5. After installation, confirm wheel alignment printout, perform a short road test, and verify no steering pull, noise, or vibration.
